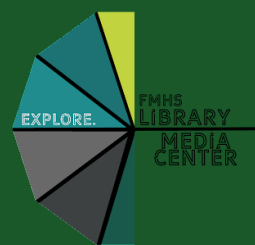

Website of the Month

Every year a greater number of newspapers require subscriptions to view articles on their websites. Through ProQuest users can search for newspapers, such as The New York Times or the Wall Street Journal.

After searching, users can go to the Publication Page for the source, and after choosing either the online or print version, they can read all articles on the website or in the paper (including the current day's articles).

ProQuest can be accessed on the resources page on the library website (password: hornets).



COLLABORATIVE IDEA OF THE MONTH

One way we can help students to develop their research skills is to help guide them through the process of gathering context about their research topic. Researching context can sometimes be as important as researching their topic directly.

For example, if you want to be able to interpret the Civil Rights Act of 1964, you must have a general understanding of the social and political context of the early 1960's.
